## **Unfinished Business**

How are you feeling? Did you experience "the pivot" from the pain of Christ's suffering and death during Holy Week to the joyous Alleluias and good news that "Christ is risen" on Easter morning?

Although the weather was not what we had hoped, the meaningful worship services, beautiful music, uplifting meal fellowship, and laughter of children hunting for Easter eggs proved a fitting conclusion to our Lenten pilgrimage to the cross and empty tomb. Perhaps leading some of us to say, "It is finished."

Only, there is more. There is Easter. And what a season it is -- a fifty-day period celebrating our new life together in Christ. A time when the lectionary texts (some of my personal favorites) invite us to experience the risen Christ in new and surprising ways. In worship, yes, but also in the unplanned encounters with our neighbors near and far, as we celebrate Jesus' presence and fullness in our lives.

While worldly powers, systems, and structures try to convince us that God is irrelevant, Easter proclaims otherwise. Easter testifies to the truth of Jesus Christ's victory over death and the grave. And Christ's victory is what gives us hope!

Encountering the risen Christ gives us hope when so much of what is happening in our world and lives seems beyond our control. Jim Wallis, author of *The Call to Conversion*, writes about Easter's invitation to conversion. Transformed by their encounter with the risen Christ, once frightened, grieving, and doubting disciples responded to their encounters with the risen Christ by proclaiming the good news of God's kingdom in word and deed with explosive force. In time, Christians became known for *how they lived* -- loving one another, caring for the poor and outcasts, sharing their gifts, and eliminating worldly divisions among themselves -- *not only for what they believed*.

The greatest need of our time, writes Wallis, is the call to be the church together for the sake of the world. And this involves a conversion, turning away from worldly ways of thinking, being, and doing, and turning toward Jesus. May we, with God's help, turn toward Jesus this Easter season. May our lives and shared ministries bear witness to the reality, "Christ is alive, and comes to bring good news to this and every age, till earth and sky and ocean ring with joy, with justice, love, and praise" (*Christ Is Alive! Let Christians Sing*, ELW, 389).

Christ is risen. Alleluia!
