# - FROM PASTOR -

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

The author of our worship planning resource describes the overarching theme of Holy Week and Easter season as one of belonging. From Thomas still finding his place despite, or perhaps because of, his doubts, to our place in the sheepfold and on the vine, to the embrace of the Spirit, we are reminded repeatedly about our place in God's family The security that knowledge brings can be a springboard for action in the world: sharing the good news, spreading the love of Jesus, and working for justice. Preaching in this season should inspire those hearing the message to act with the knowledge that, no matter the outcome, possible missteps, questions, or doubts, there is always a place for them in the fold or on the vine. Jesus does not ask us to be perfect but to abide in him and to bear fruit.

When we find our place and sense of belonging within the abiding, triune God, we are also reminded that there are others who belong to God with whom we are encouraged to build community despite our differences. Easter is a good time to invite a neighbor, co-worker or friends to worship and experience community with you.

Our Holy Week and Easter schedule is below. The changes in 2024 are earlier times for Maundy Thursday and Good Friday services, and the location of the 4th Annual Easter Sunrise Service. Easter is at it's earliest on March 31 --- and will likely be colder than in mid-April -- so we are moving it from South Park into the enclosed Courtyard at Trinity. If it is too cold or crowded in the Courtyard we will move inside into the gathering/chapel space.

A couple of weeks ago, 21 Trinity Justice ministry members gathered together to hear progress toward solutions to homelessness and increasing the elder care workforce. The justice team at



Trinity works year round toward the goal of living out God's call to "Do Justice" by addressing systems of injustice in our community. Once a year, this team calls for the support of the entire congregation to show up as ONE BODY at the Lied Center as they present and ask for well-researched steps toward solutions. All of the Justice Matters congregations set a goal to bring their average worship attendance to this Action Assembly - "52:1" - if our congregation can come together 52 times a year for worship we can come together 1 time for Justice.

Let's show the Lawrence community that Trinity Lutheran is a vibrant congregation that lives out our faith outside the church walls.

March 24 -- The account of the day of Jesus' resurrection in Mark's Gospel (Mark 16:1-8) at first reading seems incomplete and leaves the reader unsatisfied, wanting more. There is no resurrection appearance, no earthquake to explain the movement of the stone at the tomb's entrance, no conversation between Mary and the risen Christ, no disciples running to see the empty tomb. Perhaps most troubling, there is no telling of the good news of the resurrection to anyone. The Gospel ends (originally) with the women leaving the tomb saying nothing to anyone, "for they were afraid" (Mark 16:8 NRSV). What is going on?
